Habitat: anything that is wet, from ponds, to lakes, marshes, creeks, or even puddles. They like moist environments, but can live in all kinds of places that have water nearby.

They mostly eat mosquitos and gnats at this pond but their diet includes any small, helpless, and innocent bug that finds its way toward the water.



Pacific Tree Frogs are exceptionally quick swimmers, and can dive and stay underwater for up to three minutes.

When Pacific Tree Frogs have made it through adolescence, they use a silky "sack" to produce a world famous croak. The frog does this by pumping air into its sack to amplify its vocal cords' vibrating. They use this sound to attract mates, who can hear them from up to a mile away.
